

Introduction: We are in Luke chapter 6. <u>Both</u> before and during today's gospel reading, Jesus shook up His hearers – to give them a <u>right understanding of LIFE!</u>

- When His disciples were accused of working on the Sabbath, Jesus *explained why they could and *declared Himself to be "Lord of the Sabbath" (5).
- When Jesus healed a man with a shriveled hand on the Sabbath, He did not violate the Sabbath, but the Pharisees "were furious" (11).

Then, *after praying all night*, Jesus chose 12 of His disciples, "whom He also designated apostles" (13). Note: *The important choices were preceded by an all-night prayer!*Now, *coming to today's gospel reading*, this is the setting.

1. Setting: ¹⁷ Jesus came down with [the 12] and stood on a level place; and *there was* a large crowd of His disciples, and a great [multitude] of people from all Judea and Jerusalem and the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon, ¹⁸ who had come to hear Him and to be healed of their

diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were being cured. ¹⁹ And all the people were trying to touch Him, for power was coming from Him and healing them all. // Jesus had many who were interested:

- a. A large crowd of disciples: People who followed Him!
- b. Many others from the coast, Judea, and the city of Jerusalem who wanted to be healed by Jesus!

The *physical healing* attracted them; then Jesus gave them *spiritual teaching* to benefit their eternal souls.

<u>Take Note</u>: The next section is like <u>Matthew 5</u>, but also different. I believe Jesus taught similar things in different places during His ministry.

<u>Caution</u>: In this section, Jesus is going to tell us that people who are <u>poor</u>, <u>hungry</u>, <u>weeping</u>, and <u>hated</u> are eternally blessed. <u>Do the poor and hungry automatically go to heaven?</u> <u>No!</u> **So let us be careful how we understand Jesus' words**.

- 2. Great Teaching Opportunity: ²⁰ And turning His gaze toward His disciples...
 - a. The Blessed [Happy] Ones:
 - i. "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God." // Does that mean that all who are ◆living on Medicaid or ◆below the poverty level or ◆living in a third world country are members of God's kingdom? NO! The blessed ones by God's grace ◆know they are spiritually bankrupt and ◆are trusting in Jesus for eternal life!

- ii. ²¹ "Blessed are you who hunger [strongly desire something] now, for you shall be satisfied." // Hunger for what? Between 9 and 20 million die of hunger each year. Will they all be satisfied in eternity? No! Jesus is talking about people who hunger for God's forgiveness!
- iii. "Blessed are you who weep [express strong inner emotion] now, for you shall laugh." // Weep over what? Over their sins! They shall laugh as they enjoy eternity in God's glorious presence!
- iv. ²² "Blessed are you when men hate you, and ostracize you, and insult you, and scorn your name as evil, for the sake of the Son of Man. ²³ Be glad in that day and leap for joy, for behold, your reward is great in heaven. For in the same way their fathers used to treat the prophets." // Do we want to be hated? No! But, when it happens <u>BECAUSE of our relationship</u> with Jesus, then we should leap for joy!

b. The Cursed [Unhappy] Ones:

- i. ²⁴ "But woe [extreme displeasure] to you who are rich, for you are receiving your comfort in full." // Rich how? Rich in trusting in money, rather than in Jesus. For the many who keep doing it, there will be no comfort for them in eternity!
- ii. ²⁵ "Woe to you who are well-fed now, for you shall be hungry." // Where are many people today? They think they have life figured out, so they have no hunger for God's saving truth. For all such people, unless they repent, they will experience extreme displeasure for all eternity!

- iii. "Woe to you who laugh now, for you shall mourn and weep." // Do you think your sins are funny? Do you readily continue in them? Do you have no respect for the Almighty God? If you answered "YES," then you should know with certainty that mourning and weeping will characterize your existence for all eternity!
- iv. ²⁶ "Woe to you when all men speak well of you, for their fathers used to treat the false prophets in the same way." // I want your positive feedback, but, EVEN MORE, I want you to know Jesus! What are the results of my preaching? Some love me, but there are plenty who hate me! Martin Luther wrote, "Always preach in such a way that if the people listening do not come to hate their sin, they will instead HATE YOU." Paul wrote, NIV 1 Thess. 2:4 "We are not trying to please people but God…" I am trying to do the same for your eternal benefit!

Conclusion: LIFE - 2 choices:

- Do your own thing and hope for the best leading to a horrible eternity! OR
- Be open to God's word and trust in Jesus leading to a wonderful eternity!
