The Transfiguration of Our Lord – 2025 Saturday, 3/1 at 4:00 | Sunday, 3/2 at 9:00



Text: Luke 9:28-36 NAS 1995

Introduction: Dear friends: <u>Have you ever begun to do</u> <u>something hard</u> – *like losing weight*, and hoped to keep going, but then felt like quitting?

What about Jesus? He came to take away the sin of the world – **VERY HARD**, and yet **VERY IMPORTANT for everyone!** As we focus today on Jesus' transfiguration, He will receive some important encouragement from Moses and Elijah!

- 1. The Setting: ²⁸ Some eight days after these <u>sayings</u>, He took along Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. // What "sayings"?
 - a. Peter said that Jesus is "The Christ of God" (20).
 - b. <u>Jesus said</u> that He would be "rejected..., killed, and be raised on the third day" (22).
 - c. <u>Jesus said what it means to be His disciple</u>: **Deny ourselves** and **take up our cross daily** (23) <u>TOUGH STUFF</u>: Say "no" to our desires **and** take all the sufferings that come our way for living as Christians.

- 2. Jesus was Radically Changed *Transfigured*: ²⁹ And while He was praying, the appearance of His face became different [no longer looking like Jesus], and His clothing [which was probably a dull color,] became white and gleaming. // During Jesus' whole life He looked only human but He showed His real identity to Peter, James, and John as His face and clothes radically changed before their eyes!
- 3. Heaven on Earth: ³⁰ And behold, two men were talking with Him; and they were Moses and Elijah, ³¹ who, appearing in glory, were speaking of His departure which He was about to accomplish at Jerusalem.
 - a. Moses: Called to →lead the Israelites out of Egypt,
 →receive God's Law, and →point to the Messiah.
 - b. <u>Elijah</u>: Used by the LORD to ***speak** against the false worship of Baal and ***call** the people to repentance.
 - c. Appeared in Glory: What does that mean?
 - i. **Moses** died (Deu. 34:5) and **Elijah** was taken to heaven without dying (2Ki. 2:11).
 - ii. They left this life as believers in the Messiah and continued to live with God in heaven (Lk. 20:38).
 - iii. Believers will receive their glorified bodies when Jesus returns (1Jo. 3:2).
 - iv. Moses and Elijah appeared as believers with "an excellent reputation" (John 5:44) (BW, Friberg).
 - d. <u>Jesus' Departure</u> (exodus): It included His suffering and death. Jesus said, "Now My soul has become troubled; and what shall I say, 'Father, save Me from this hour'? But for this purpose I came to this hour" (Jn. 12:27).

- 4. Awe: 32 Now Peter and his companions had been overcome [burdened, weigh downed] with sleep; but when they were fully awake, they saw [Jesus'] glory and the two men standing with Him. 33 And as these [men] were leaving Him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three tabernacles: one for You, and one for Moses, and one for Elijah"-- not realizing what he was saying.
 - a. <u>They Saw</u>: Jesus was changed *transfigured*, and they *recognized* Moses and Elijah appearing in glory.
 - b. <u>They Liked</u>: The sight was <u>awe-inspiring</u> *respect mixed with fear and wonder!*
 - c. <u>They Wanted It to Continue</u>: So, Peter proposed the three temporary shelters *to extend the experience*.
- 5. Clarification and Command: ³⁴ While [Peter] was saying this, a cloud formed and *began* to overshadow them; and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. ³⁵ Then a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is My Son, My Chosen One; listen to Him!" // The cloud formed *like a dense fog* and resulted in fear.
 - a. This is My Son, My Chosen One: Those words tell us the main point of the Season of Epiphany: JESUS IS GOD! Jesus is the greatest ▶teacher, ▶miracle-worker, and ▶example, but He MUST BE GOD to remove the sins of the whole world!!
 - b. <u>Listen to Him</u>: By God's grace we know WHO He is, but it is also critical to <u>LISTEN TO HIM</u> to gladly:

 hear Him, *think about His words, *understand those words, *believe them to be true, and *obey them in our daily lives!

- 6. Inside Information for Sharing Later: ³⁶ And when the voice [of God the Father] had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they [Peter, James, and John] kept silent, and reported to no one in those days any of the things which they had seen. // The whole process may have been rapid − *the change, *the appearances, and *the voice, but God accomplished His purposes:
 - a. <u>Jesus</u>: He was encouraged and ready to keep going no matter what!
 - b. <u>Disciples Then and Now</u>: Since we are sure that Jesus is God, let us keep following Him *no matter what!*

Conclusion:
