

Introduction: Dear friends, this sermon focuses on the popular Lenten hymn: **Christ, the Life of All the Living**. As I read and comment on the words, let us be filled with gratitude for Jesus' \*obedient, \*loving, and \*excruciating work to save us from our sins and open the way to heaven.

- 1. Christ, the Life of All the Living: This stanza *summarizes* the work Jesus did to save us:
  - a. Christ, the life of all the living, Christ, the death of death, our foe, Who, Thyself for me once giving, To the darkest depths of woe: // The Father designed the world, then the Son created it "All things came into being through <u>Him</u> [the Son, who was with the Father before creation]" (John 1:3). Then, due to our sin: The Son of God put on flesh to defeat death for our eternal benefit!
  - b. Through Thy suff'rings, death, and merit, I eternal life inherit. // Jesus, the Christ, obediently entered great suffering and death – "He Himself bore our sins in His

body on the cross" (1 Pet. 2:24), so that we – by grace through faith – could receive the gift of eternal life!

c. Thousand, thousand thanks shall be, Dearest Jesus, unto Thee. // Those words conclude stanzas 1-6. Paul wrote: "...thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor. 15:57). Yes, so let us give Jesus 1 million expressions of thanks!

## 2. Christ Took Much on Himself to Deliver Us:

- a. Thou, ah! Thou, hast taken on Thee, Bonds and stripes, a cruel rod; Pain and scorn were heaped upon Thee, O Thou sinless Son of God! // Jesus, though sinless and innocent – and able to escape at any moment, permitted Himself to be bound and beaten!
- b. Thus, didst Thou my soul deliver, From the bonds of sin forever. // Our sins put us in bondage, so Jesus was "delivered over by the predetermined plan and foreknowledge of God" (Acts 2:1). Let us be thankful!

## 3. Christ Did His Work Alone:

- a. Thou hast borne the smiting only, That my wounds might all be whole; Thou hast suffered, sad and lonely, Rest to give my weary soul; // We were helpless, so Jesus did everything for our salvation; He said: "I have trodden the wine trough alone" (Isa. 63:3).
- b. Yea, the curse of God enduring, Blessing unto me securing. // The Bible says that "Christ redeemed us from the curse of the Law, having become a curse for us..." (Gal. 3:13). Since we cursed ourselves, a severe penalty was required. Amazingly, Jesus bore our curse to open the way of eternal blessing! Let us honor Him!

## 4. Christ Permitted Others to Greatly Abuse Him:

- a. Heartless scoffers did surround Thee, Treating Thee with shameful scorn, And with piercing thorns they crowned Thee. All disgrace Thou, Lord, hast borne, // THINK The Son of God, the source of life, permitted those cruel Roman Soldiers to \*mock Him as a false king and \*drive those sharp thorns into His holy head.
- b. That as Thine Thou mightest own me, And with heav'nly glory crown me. // Jesus perfectly obeyed His Father, He prayed – "not My will, but Yours be done" (Lk. 22:42). May our hearts and lives keep showing forth much sincere thanksgiving!

#### 5. Christ Absorbed the Fists and False Accusations:

- a. Thou hast suffered men to bruise Thee, That from pain I might be free; Falsely did Thy foes accuse Thee: Thence I gain security; // The great exchange: We sinned, but He was bruised; we are guilty, but He was accused – "by His wounds you were healed" (1Pe. 2:24).
- b. Comfortless Thy soul did languish, Me to comfort in my anguish. // Jesus received our sins "...the LORD has caused the iniquity of us all To fall on Him" (Isa. 53:6). Now, in Him, we have comfort and peace TYSM!

#### 6. Christ Bore the Horror of Crucifixion without Complaint:

a. Thou hast suffered great affliction, And hast borne it patiently, Even death by crucifixion, Fully to atone for me; // 700 years before the Son of God put on flesh, the LORD told us what would happen to Jesus: "He was oppressed and He was afflicted, Yet He did not open His mouth..." (Isa. 53:7). So that we, through Jesus, would be AT ONE / MADE RIGHT with God.

b. Thou didst choose to be tormented, That my doom should be prevented. // THINK – Jesus was completely innocent, so His flogging and crucifixion were torture! Jesus endured it all so that we could \*be gifted with righteousness and \*escape the doom we deserved! Let us gladly tell others what Christ has done for us and all!

# 7. Christ Did It All; He Is Enough:

- a. Then, for all that wrought my pardon, For Thy sorrows deep and sore, For Thine anguish in the Garden, I will thank Thee evermore, Thank Thee for Thy groaning, sighing, For Thy bleeding and Thy dying, // Those words are a horrible and yet a beautiful summary of Jesus' finished work – "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life" (Jn. 3:16).
- b. For that last triumphant cry, And shall praise Thee, Lord, on high. // Once Jesus had completed all His work, He received a drink and then cried out: *It has been paid in full!* He fully paid the horrible penalty for everyone! Therefore, let us *It us* for all the horrible penalty for eternal life, *It hank Him with our words and deeds, and It herefore to repent and believe!*

Let Us Pray: Dearest Jesus, thousand, thousand thanks **from** *us to Thee* – now and forevermore!

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
