What Are Your Hopes and Dreams?

Text: 1 Corinthians 15:19-26 NAS 1995

Introduction: Dear friends: In comparison to ETERNITY, life on earth is much shorter! We all have hopes and dreams for this life, but do we also have them for the life to come?

Today, we focus on eight verses in **1 Corinthians 15**, a.k.a., the resurrection chapter. We will consider:

- Jesus' resurrection!
- Our resurrection!
- The end of the world!
- 1. Jesus' Resurrection: ¹⁹ If we have hoped in [counted on]
 Christ in this life only, we are of all men most to be pitied
 [miserable]. ²⁰ But now Christ has been raised from the
 dead, the first fruits of those who are asleep. // Being
 close to Christ has two results: now—persecution, later—
 bliss! If Christ is only for now, what a miserable situation!
 - a. <u>Resurrection Promised</u>: Jesus said to His disciples: "The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes and be killed and **be raised up on the third day**" (Luke 9:22). // **Day 1**: died on Friday; **Day 2**: rested on Saturday; **Day 3**: raised on Sunday!

- b. <u>Resurrection Fulfilled</u>: Peter preached: Jesus was "delivered over by the predetermined plan and foreknowledge of God... / godless men... put Him to death. <u>But God raised Him up again</u>" (Acts 2:23-24).
- c. Jesus Is Called the First Fruits:
 - i. <u>The Festival</u>: The LORD commanded seven annual festivals in Leviticus chapter 23. The third festival is Firstfruits; on that day, the first ripe sheaf of barley was waved before the LORD to acknowledge His provision and give Him thanks.
 - ii. <u>Jesus' Resurrection</u>: The festival of Firstfruits always falls on the Sunday after Passover, which was the day Jesus was raised. <u>Jesus</u>, the Ultimate <u>First Fruit</u>, was raised on the festival of Firstfruits! It was all part of God's awesome plan to save us!
- 2. Our Resurrection: ²¹ For since by a man [Adam] came death, by a man [Jesus] also came the resurrection of the dead. ²² For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ all will be made alive. ²³ But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits [on Easter Sunday], after that those who are Christ's at His coming...
 - a. <u>By Adam Came Death</u>: Romans 5:12 "...just as through one man [Adam] sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, because all sinned..."
 - b. By Christ Came Resurrection to Life:
 - Without Jesus and His Saving Work: →We would be hopeless and helpless now, and →we would be apart from God forever when we died.

ii. With Jesus and His Saving Work: For all who have Spirit-worked sorrow for sin and trust in Jesus, they have *God's gift of forgiveness, *God's gift of eternal life, and *the promise of being with God forever! Even though the repentant and the unrepentant seem the same − dead and buried, there are HUGE unseen differences: *at the time of death (Luke 16:19-31) and *in eternity (Mt. 25:46)!

c. The Day of Resurrection:

- Two Comings: In the past the Son of God put on flesh to take away the sin of the world. In the future He will come again to raise all people (Acts 24:15b).
- ii. Some to Life, Some to Judgment: John 5:28-29 [Jesus said:] "Do not marvel at this; for an hour is coming, in which all who are in the tombs will hear His voice, and will come forth; those who did the good deeds to a resurrection of life, those who committed the evil deeds to a resurrection of judgment." // Here is the proper understanding:
 - Good Deeds Do Not Save: Romans 3:20 "...by the works of the Law no flesh will be justified in [God's] sight..."
 - Good Deeds Only Come from Faith: Hebrews
 11:6 "...without faith it is impossible to please [God]..."
 - 3. Saving Faith Always Results in Works: Works are the fruit of faith. When faith is genuine, the works will show (to watch, listen to, or read an important sermon: click here or type in this link: BLC7500.com/Sermons/49777/Details).

- 3. The End of the World: ²⁴ then *comes* the end, when [Christ] hands over the kingdom to the God and Father, when He has abolished all rule and all authority and power. ²⁵ For He must reign until He has put all His enemies under His feet. ²⁶ The last enemy that will be abolished is death.
 - a. <u>Jesus Is Reigning</u>: After Jesus completed His saving work, He declared: <u>Matthew 28:18</u> "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth." // <u>Today</u>, there are Christians who believe Jesus will reign on earth in the future, *but* the Bible teaches that He is reigning now (Eph. 1:22-23). b. The Last Enemy:

- i. Oil and Water Do Not Mix: Neither do sin and a holy God. Sin brings death, so death is coming for each of us! No matter how good we are, no one can stand before God in his sin (Ps. 130:3)!
- ii. <u>Eternal Hopes and Dreams</u>: They will come true for all who know Jesus! **Now** – such people live with <u>peace</u> and <u>purpose</u>! **In eternity** – such people will forever enjoy <u>God's eternal blessings</u>!
