8: Preparation to Receive

The pastor of a congregation is a servant of Christ and a steward of the mysteries of God (1Co. 4:1). He is responsible to manage the mysteries in agreement with God's word.

All who desire to receive the supper are called to examine themselves (1Co. 11:28).

What follows are ten **yes** or **no** questions. Please read each question and the supporting passage(s) *before* answering.

1. Do I believe the Bible is true? Y N

<u>Jesus prayed to His Father</u>: "Your word is **truth**" (John 17:17). Get the evidence – See this brochure: <u>The Bible Is</u> <u>True</u>

2. Am I sorry for my sins? Y N

<u>Godly sorrow is essential</u>: "...the <u>sorrow</u> that is according to *the will of* God produces a <u>repentance</u> without regret, *leading* to <u>salvation</u>... (2Co. 7:10).

3. Am I trusting in Jesus for eternal life? Y N

<u>Regarding Jesus</u>: "...**there is salvation in no one else**; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among mankind by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12).

4. Am I baptized? Y N

<u>All nations</u>: "Go... and make disciples of <u>all the nations</u>, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit..." (Matt. 28:19).

<u>All ages</u>: "...be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and <u>your</u> <u>children</u>..." (Acts 2:38-39).

<u>God's work</u>: "<u>He</u> [God the Father] saved us... by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit" (Titus 3:5).

5. Do I desire to live for Christ? Y N

<u>New life, new desire</u>: "He died for all, so that those who live would no longer live for themselves, but **for Him who died and rose on their behalf** (2Co. 5:15).

6. Am I forgiving all others? Y N

It is vital to forgive: "...forgive, if you have <u>anything</u> against <u>anyone</u>, so that your Father who is in heaven will also forgive you for your offenses" (Mk 11:25).

7. Am I doing my part to reconcile? Y N

<u>Do what you can</u>: "...**so far as it depends on you**, be at peace with all people (Rom. 12:18).

8. Are the elements of the Lord's Supper <u>bread</u>, <u>body</u>, <u>wine</u>, and <u>blood</u>? Y N

<u>Note the underlined words</u>: "Is the <u>cup</u> of blessing [wine] which we bless not a sharing in the <u>blood</u> of Christ? Is the <u>bread</u> which we break not a sharing in the <u>body</u> of Christ?" (1Co. 10:16).

9. Is the main benefit of the Supper the assurance of the forgiveness of sins? Y N

<u>Jesus said</u>: "'Take, eat; this is My body.' … 'Drink from it, all of you; for this is My blood of the covenant, which is being poured out for many <u>for forgiveness of sins</u>'" (Mt. 26:26-28).

10. Do I understand and agree with the teachings of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS)? Y N

<u>Unity is important</u>: "I urge you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you <u>all agree</u> and that there be <u>no divisions</u> among you, but that you be made complete in the same mind and in the same judgment" (1Co. 1:10).

Only receive from an altar where you **know** and **believe** <u>the teachings</u>: "Look at the people of Israel; **are those who eat the sacrifices not partners in the altar**? What do I mean then? That food sacrificed to idols is anything, or that an idol is anything? No, but I say that things which the Gentiles sacrifice, they sacrifice to demons

and not to God; and I do not want you to become partners with demons" (1Co. 10:18-20).

9: How to Receive

Some best practices:

- Bread—Body: Into your hand or into your mouth. If into your hand, place one open hand on top of the other. Need gluten free? Let us know.
- Wine—Blood: Chalice or individual cup; wine or alcohol removed wine. If from the chalice, look forward and assist in tipping the cup.
