Is Your FAITH Living, Busy, Active, Mighty?

Text: Hebrews 11:17-31; 12:1-3 NAS 2020

Introduction: Dear friends: We hear a lot about FAITH, but what is it? This is the Bible definition: "...faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (Heb. 11:1). In other words, FAITH IS BELIEVING WITHOUT SEEING!

But let's be careful – **some** <u>faith SAVES</u>, **some** <u>does NOT</u>:

- These Kinds Do NOT Save:
 - Intellectual Assent: A person agrees in his mind but does NOT believe in his heart.
 - Temporal Faith: A person believes for a while, but his faith is eventually destroyed by the devil, the world, and/or his own sinful nature.
- These Words Help Us Understand Saving Faith:
 - KAT: Saving faith has three essential ingredients:
 Knowledge, Agreement, and Trust (in Jesus).
 - FAITH: Make a word from each letter Forsaking
 All (all trust in self) Trust Him (Jesus for eternal life).

503 years ago (in 1522), Rev. Dr. Martin Luther wrote these words as part of his preface to Paul's letter to the Romans: "**Faith**... is a divine work in us which changes us and makes us to be born anew of God, John 1[:12-13]. It kills the old Adam and makes us altogether different men, in **heart** and **spirit**

and **mind** and **powers**; and it brings with it the Holy Spirit. O it is a <u>living</u>, <u>busy</u>, <u>active</u>, <u>mighty</u> thing, this faith. It is impossible for it not to be doing good works [continually]."

In last week's epistle reading (Hebrews 11:1-16), the phrase, "By faith" appeared 7 times; in this sermon, 11 more times. In each case, people who believed in the coming Messiah expressed their faith by saying or doing incredible things.

- 1. ¹⁷ By faith Abraham, when he was tested [Gen. 22-10], offered up Isaac [as a burnt offering], and [Abraham] who had received the promises was offering up his only son; ¹⁸ it was [Isaac] to whom it was said, "Through Isaac your DESCENDANTS SHALL BE NAMED." ¹⁹ [Abraham] considered that God is able to raise people even from the dead, from which he also received [Isaac] back as a type. // Abraham's faith kept him moving forward to offer his only son until the LORD told him to stop! Isaac's near sacrifice pointed ahead to Jesus' complete sacrifice for our sins!
- 2. 20 By faith Isaac blessed Jacob [Gen. 27:27-29] and Esau, even regarding things to come. // Isaac gave the greater blessing to Jacob the second-born, because the LORD planned to bring the Messiah through Jacob.
- 3. ²¹By faith Jacob, as he was dying, blessed each of the sons of Joseph [Gen. 48:1-20], and worshiped, leaning on the top of his staff. // Jacob, as commanded by the LORD, blessed Joseph's first two sons, Ephraim and Manasseh, as his own. 300 years later, their descendants received a portion of land when Canaan was conquered and divided.
- 4. ²² By faith Joseph, when he was dying, made mention of the exodus of the sons of Israel [Gen. 15:13; 50:24], and gave orders concerning his bones. // Joseph believed the LORD about the coming <u>enslavement</u>, <u>exodus</u>, & <u>Messiah!</u>

- 5. 23 By faith Moses, when he was born, was hidden for three months by his parents, because they saw he was a beautiful child [Ex. 2:2]; and they were not afraid of the king's edict [Ex. 1:16]. // Pharoah commanded that all newborn boys be put to death, but Moses' parents expressed their Messianic faith by keeping him alive!
- 6. ²⁴ By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter [Ex. 2:10], ²⁵ choosing rather to endure ill-treatment with the people of God than to enjoy the temporary pleasures of sin, ²⁶ considering the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures of Egypt; for he was looking to the reward. // Moses, by faith, gave up *great visible riches* because he believed in *THE GREATER INVISIBLE RICHES* yet to come. Today, many are choosing *the temporary pleasures of sin* over *THE ETERNAL RICHES OF GOD IN CHRIST*. Let's not!!
- 7. 27 By faith [Moses] left Egypt [Ex. 2:15], not fearing the wrath of the king; for he persevered, as though seeing Him who is unseen. // By faith Moses rightly feared / trusted in the LORD. IT IS BEST FOR US TO DO THE SAME!
- 8. ²⁸ By faith [Moses] kept the Passover and the sprinkling of the blood [Ex. 12:1-13], so that the destroyer of the firstborn would not touch them. // The LORD decreed that all firstborn males in Egypt would die <u>unless</u> they put lamb blood on their doorframes. Moses <u>believed</u>, <u>did it</u>, and <u>encouraged</u> the other Israelites to do the same!
- 9. ²⁹ By faith [the Israelites] passed through the Red Sea as through dry land [Ex. 14:22-29]; and the Egyptians, when they attempted it, were drowned. // When the Israelites were being pursued by Pharoah's army, they by faith stepped between the walls of water to safety.

- 10.30 By faith the walls of Jericho fell down after the Israelites had marched around them for seven days [Joshua 6:20]. // When tested by logic, the ways of the LORD seem foolish; nevertheless, the Israelites by faith obeyed and the LORD and He gave them total victory over Jericho!
- 11. ³¹ By faith the prostitute Rahab did not perish along with those who were disobedient [Joshua 6:23], after she had welcomed the spies in peace. ... // Rahab, of Jericho, believed in the LORD, so she *risked her life, *hid the Israelite spies, and *was spared, along with her family!
- 12. 12:1 Therefore, since we also have such a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us [that is, so many great examples of faith], let's rid ourselves of every obstacle [weight (ankle weight)] and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let's run with endurance the [marathon] race that is set before us, 2 looking only at Jesus [like Peter walking on the water], the originator [opening the one way] and perfecter [finisher] of the faith [by the Spirit He poured out], who for the joy [of redeeming mankind] set before Him endured the cross, despising [thinking little of] the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. 3 For consider Him who has endured such hostility by sinners against Himself, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart. // Jesus faced the forces of evil and won!

 Now, by grace through faith, we are sharing in His victory!

Let Us Pray: Dear HS! Keep us trusting in Jesus' alone for eternal life and cause our **FAITH** to keep showing itself as *living, *busy, *mighty, and *active in every circumstance!!!!

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
