Do We Own or Manage Our Money? If we manage – how? ☐ To get whatever we want! ☐ To extend God's kingdom!

Text: Luke 16:1-15 NAS 2020

Introduction: Dear friends: I hope you ⇒believe the Bible and ⇒know Jesus as Savior and Lord (if not, go here: The Bible Is True; Why Is Faith in Jesus the Ticket to Heaven).

Followers of Jesus – what about money and possessions?

- We are managers, <u>not</u> owners. God has gifted us with whatever we have (Ja. 1:17). It's ours to <u>manage</u>! Eventually God will gift it to someone else (Eccl. 2:18)! It is critical to *understand, *believe, and *apply God's management principles!
- When we apply God's management principles, He increases our money and possessions:
 - Proverbs 3:9-10 "Honor the LORD from your wealth
 [Mal. 3:10], And from the first of all your produce; So your barns will be filled with plenty, And your vats will overflow with new wine."
 - Luke 6:38 "Give, and it will be given to you. They will pour into your lap a good measure-- pressed down, shaken together, and running over. For by your standard of measure it will be measured to you in return."
- What is the purpose of the increase? →To get whatever we want or →to use it to extend God's kingdom!

<u>In today's gospel reading</u>, Jesus told a story about a man who was a manager who wasted his boss's possessions.

- 1. The Manager Was Losing His Job: ¹ Now [Jesus] was also saying to the disciples [Jesus wants His disciples to apply His word and others, including Jewish leaders who were present, to repent], "There was a rich man who had a manager, and this manager was reported to him as squandering his possessions. ² And he summoned him and said to him, 'What is this I hear about you? Give an accounting of your management, for you can no longer be manager.'" // He got caught, so his job was ending!
- 2. The Manager Made Friends with His Customers: 3 "And the manager said to himself, 'What am I to do, since my master is taking the management away from me? I am not strong enough to dig; I am ashamed to beg. 4 I know what I will do, so that when I am removed from the management people will welcome me into their homes.' ⁵ And he summoned each one of his master's debtors [one by one, privately], and he began saying to the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' 6 And he said, 'A hundred jugs of oil [totaling between 800 and 900 gallons].' And he said to him, 'Take your bill, and sit down quickly and write fifty.' 7 Then he said to another, 'And how much do you owe?' And he said, 'A hundred kors of wheat [totaling 1,000 bushels].' He said to him, 'Take your bill, and write eighty." // The manager gave significant reductions to his customers, which made them indebted to him!
- 3. The Manager Was Complimented by His Boss: 8 "And his master complimented the unrighteous manager because he had acted shrewdly [wisely, insightfully]; for the sons of

this age are more shrewd in relation to their own kind than the sons of light."

- a. The manager was shrewd, so he →thought about his situation and →planned for the loss of his job. Since he could not dig and would not beg, he used the money under his control to compel his customers to provide a place for him to stay until he got another job.
- b. Most Christians are **not shrewd**, so they do <u>not</u> think ahead <u>nor</u> plan for the life to come! Jesus is calling us to <u>THINK</u> and to <u>CHANGE</u>!
- 4. The Application for Christians: 9 "And I say to you [My disciples], make friends for yourselves by means of the wealth of unrighteousness [the temporary money and possessions under your management], so that when it is all gone, they will receive you into the eternal dwellings."
 - a. Did You Catch the Parallel?
 - i. The manager used money to gain earthly friends!
 - ii. We should use money to gain eternal friends!
 - b. What Is Typical? As non-believers use their money for their earthly gain, believers tend to do the same⊗.
 - c. <u>Can You See Our Foolishness</u>? Non-believers think **this life is it**, so they live for now. We know **this life is NOT it**, but we still live for now **③**.
 - d. How Did Jesus Instruct Us? Matthew 6:20-21 "...lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal; for where your treasure is [what is important to you], there will your heart be also." // See Matthew 25:35-37: hungry-food, thirsty-drink...

e. What Is Coming? Romans 14:12 "...each one of us shall give account of himself to God." // Be ready!

5. Important Realities:

- a. ¹⁰ "The one who is faithful in a very little thing is also faithful in much; and the one who is unrighteous in a very little thing is also unrighteous in much. ¹¹ Therefore if you have not been faithful in the use of unrighteous wealth [minor], who will entrust the true wealth to you [MAJOR]? // No one!
- b. ¹² And if you have not been faithful in *the use of* that which <u>is another's</u> [we are only managers], who will give you that which is your own? // No one!
- c. ¹³ No servant can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to one and despise the other. <u>You cannot serve God and wealth</u>." // Most <u>pretend</u> to serve God but <u>secretly</u> serve wealth. Let us repent!

Conclusion: ¹⁴ Now the Pharisees, who were lovers of money, were listening to all these things and were ridiculing [Jesus]. ¹⁵ And He said to them, "You are the ones who justify yourselves in the sight of people, but God knows your hearts; because that which is highly esteemed among people is detestable in the sight of God." // The Pharisees fooled most people, maybe we do too, but God knows each of our hearts. So, let us truly *repent and *honor Him!

Let Us Pray: Dear LORD, You have given us countless gifts to manage. Help us to *be thankful and *extend Your kingdom!
