Text: John 1:1-14 NAS 2020 By the Holy Spirit: Let's *understand and *apply the Bible in our lives!

Introduction: Dear friends: It is amazing that Jesus:

- Taught with authority!
- Worked mighty miracles!
- Lived without sin!

Those things were **visible** to the people who experienced His ministry, but what about the **invisible** realities? Let's go behind the scenes to learn about:

- His place from eternity!
- The amazing work God did through His Son!
- The preparation God made before He sent His Son!
- 1. What Can We Say About the Son of God? John 1:1-14...
 - a. ¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. // The "Word" is the Son of

- **God**; He was with God the Father from eternity before the creation of the world.
- b. ³ All things came into being through Him, and apart from Him not even one thing came into being that has come into being.
 - i. <u>Hebrews 1:2</u> "[God] has spoken to us in *His* Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, <u>through</u> whom He also made the world."
 - ii. <u>Let us pause and think</u>: Regarding every good thing that has come into being, *God* brought it into being through His Son!
- c. ⁴In Him was life [ζωή zoe], and the life was the Light of mankind. ⁵ And the Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not grasp it. // The Son of God is the source of physical life and eternal life. If only everyone understood ₱ why they live now and ₱ what God is offering to them through Jesus life everlasting!
- 2. What Can We Say About John the Baptizer? God worked through John to prepare the way for Jesus!
 - a. ⁶ A man came, *one* sent from God, *and* his name was John.
 - i. He was sent from God: As a prophet of God!
 - ii. <u>He was sent</u>: To call people to ***be sorry** for their sins, ***turn** from their sins, and ***receive** the Christ as Savior and Lord.
 - b. ⁷ [John] came as a witness, to testify about the Light, so that all might believe through him.
 - i. God sent John to prepare the way for Jesus:
 When a king was coming to visit, →the roads

- were repaired and *the garbage cleaned up. John called people to prepare by repenting!
- ii. <u>Jesus said of Himself</u>: John 8:12 "I am the light of the world; the one who follows Me will not walk in the darkness, but will have the Light of life."
- c. ⁸ [John] was not the Light, but *he came* to testify about the Light.
 - i. Even though some thought John might be the Promised Messiah: He was not. He was not adequate to remove Jesus' sandals (Mt. 3:11).
 - ii. John pointed people to know and follow Jesus: John said regarding Jesus, John 3:30 "He must increase, but I must decrease."

3. What Can We Say About Jesus, the Christ?

- a. ⁹ [Jesus] was the true Light that, coming into the world, enlightens every person.
 - By nature, we were all in spiritual darkness: We were *separated from God, *unable to understand the truth, and *had no desire to know God.
 - ii. <u>But Jesus is the true Light</u>: To \$show us the truth,
 \$show us the path to restoration, and \$open the way from us to God (1 Peter 3:18).
- b. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world came into being through Him, and yet the world did not know Him. // To those who know Jesus He is everything ⊕! But to others, He is nothing ⊕.
- c. ¹¹ He came to His own, and His own people did not accept Him.

- i. God promised that the Messiah would be a descendant of Abraham: Then, during the OT era, God kept reminding the people of ◆their need to be saved and ◆the Messiah's coming.
- ii. <u>However, when He came</u>: Jesus was <u>not</u> what they expected, so, *sadly*, most rejected Him.
- d. ¹² But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name, ¹³ who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of a man, but of God.
 - i. <u>By God's grace</u>: For some, God →opened their eyes to the truth, →made them sorry, and →gave them faith.
 - ii. <u>By God's action</u>: As <u>our mothers</u> gave birth to us **physically**, <u>God</u> has given birth to us **spiritually**. *Through the Christ we have been born again!*
- e. ¹⁴ And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us; and we saw His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. // The Word who was with God in the beginning: He put on flesh for our eternal benefit to take away our sins.

 Therefore, today and always, let us *trust in, *celebrate, and *live for the Christ of Christmas!
