God With Us

A Chronology of the Four Gospels Regarding Our Savior's Birth! Part 6:



<u>Luke 1:57-66</u> – John the Baptizer Is *Born and Named!* <u>Luke 1:67-80</u> – Zechariah Tells *in Advance* About Jesus and John! Join Us: Christmas Eve at 6 PM; Christmas Day at 10 AM

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: In three days it will be Christmas Eve; even though you may have much to do, I'm so glad you are here today to be blessed by the Christ of Christmas!

<u>This sermon is part 6</u> of our "**God With Us**" series! <u>In part 5</u> we focused on *Mary's visit to Elizabeth*: both were pregnant – •Elizabeth with John, •Mary with Jesus! Notice the number 6 on the timeline in our "<u>God With Us</u>" brochure: It's March of 5 BC, *the time of the Passover*, when Elizabeth gave birth to John. We will also hear Zechariah tell *in advance* about Jesus and John!

- 1. John the Baptizer Is Born and Named:
 - a. ^{NIV} Luke 1:57 When it was time for Elizabeth to have her baby, she gave birth to a son. ⁵⁸ Her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown her great mercy, and they shared her joy. // So, about 10 months earlier, the angel had told Zechariah: "...your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son..." (Luke 1:13 NIV) Then, just as promised, the Lord brought it about and those who heard "shared her joy." The Bible says: "God is not a man, that He should lie, Nor a son of man, that He should repent; Has He said, and will He not do it? Or has He spoken, and will He not make it good?" (Num. 23:19 NAS) Therefore, let us always believe God's Word!
 - ⁵⁹ On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they were going to name him after his father
 Zechariah, ⁶⁰ but his mother spoke up and said, "No!

He is to be called John." ⁶¹ They said to her, "There is no one among your relatives who has that name." ⁶² Then they made signs to his father, to find out what

⁵² Then they made signs to his father, to find out what he would like to name the child. ⁶³ He asked for a writing tablet, and to everyone's astonishment he wrote, "His name is John." ⁶⁴ Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue was loosed, and he began to speak, praising God. // Again, the word of the Lord came to pass: 10 months earlier- in reference to Elizabeth giving birth to a son and Zechariah naming him John - the angel had said to Zechariah: "...you will be silent and not able to speak until the day this happens..." (Luke 1:20 NIV) Then, immediately, "he began to speak, praising God." Let us believe every word of God!

- c. ⁶⁵ The neighbors were all filled with awe, and throughout the hill country of Judea people were talking about all these things. ⁶⁶ Everyone who heard this wondered about it, asking, "What then is this child going to be?" For the Lord's hand was with him. // So +John's conception being told in advance, +Zechariah being unable to speak, and +Zechariah's speech being suddenly restored are some of the ways in which God made it clear that *He had a very special purpose for John*.
- Zechariah Tells in Advance About Jesus and John: Earlier in this series, when the angels told in advance about John and Jesus, those were messages from the Lord! This section is similar as the Lord tells in advance through Zechariah – first about Jesus, then about John!
 - a. <u>Jesus</u>: ^{NIV} Luke 1:67 His father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied:
 - i. ⁶⁸ "Praise be to the Lord, <u>the God of Israel</u>, because he <u>has come and has redeemed his</u>

people. // The God of Israel came in the Person of Jesus, who – at the time – was still in Mary's womb; he came for the purpose of buying back His people from sin and death through Jesus' finished work!

ii. ⁶⁹ He has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David ⁷⁰ (as he said through his holy prophets of long ago), ⁷¹ salvation from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us--⁷² to show mercy to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant, ⁷³ the oath he swore to our father Abraham: ⁷⁴ to rescue us from the hand of our enemies, and to enable us to serve him without fear ⁷⁵ in holiness and righteousness before him all our days." // Picture a bull with horns; such an animal could rip and kill a person with those horns! In a similar way – just as God had promised – He raised up a powerful champion in the line of David to rescue us from our enemies, which include sin, death, and those who hate us! Even though we <have sinned and <deserved bad, God has shown us great good through Jesus! Now, with peace and joy, we can serve God each day "in holiness and righteousness..."

b. John: ⁷⁶ "And you, my child, will be called a prophet of the Most High; for you will go on before the Lord

- i. to prepare the way for him, // John prepared the way for Jesus by calling people to repent, thus to
 see their sins, *be sorry, and *believe in Jesus as their only Savior!
- ii. ⁷⁷ to give his people the knowledge of salvation through the forgiveness of their sins, ⁷⁸ because of the tender mercy of our God, by which the

rising sun will come to us from heaven //

Baptized infants are saved but have no knowledge of their salvation; however, for us who are aware of our sin, God has made it known to us that we need to be saved. Furthermore, by the Spirit working through the Word (Rom. 8:16), God assures us that we are saved, thus forgiven in His sight!

- iii. ⁷⁹ to shine on those living in darkness and in the shadow of death, // Think about people who do not yet know Jesus; they are engulfed in spiritual darkness and ebbing ever closer to death and eternal doom. Therefore, Jesus came to shine on such people to *show them the truth and *set them free (John 8:31-32)!
- iv. to guide our feet into the path of peace." // According to our sinful nature we are all bent on taking the path of destruction, but God, in His great mercy, is working through Word and Sacrament, to keep us on "the path of peace."

⁸⁰ And the child grew and became strong in spirit; and he lived in the desert until he appeared publicly to Israel. // As God used 40 years in Egypt and another 40 years in the wilderness to prepare Moses to serve, so God used John's years in the desert to prepare him to make the way for Jesus!
